E.	x	Other Recommendation and Comments: According to the data and responses submitted, it appears the school is meeting the standard of Test 3 for the provision of athletic opportunities. In the area of benefits, reported total athletic spending falls within the acceptable parameters both on a percentage and per athlete basis. However, about half of the sport offerings show zero amounts in the benefit area of awards. This should be re-examined by your Gender Equity Committee and reflected in the 2012 Corrective Action Plan so as to insure equity among all sports. Thank you.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. - 1) For Column 1, list the number of interscholastic teams offered for girls and boys at each competitive level (varsity, junior varsity, and freshman). For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8.
- 2) For Column 2, list the number of participants at each level. For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8.
