- Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).
   Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). #### Plans to Address Interest:

Even though 23 students responded on the survey as having an interest in football and there are schools in our area that also have football, it is not realistic for a school our size to field a football team. We already offer an unusually high number of KHSAA sanctioned sports for our students â€" more than some schools twice our size. Plus many of those who checked football are already on the soccer or cross country team and to start a football team would potentially take away the participants from these teams.

However, the KHSAA strongly encourages compliant schools to identify items for improvement (Column 1), activities to accomplish the improvement (Column 2) and a timetable for completion (Column 3) that will strengthen the athletic program.
