This disparity should be monitored by administration and reviewed by the Gender Equity Committee. Thank you. |

Instructions:
*Number of $8^{\text {th }}$ grade students \& below used in Column 3 and Column 4 calculations:

1) Determine the total number of girls enrolied, (place in Row 1, Column 1).

Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total $100 \%$.
4) Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. For example, if Jane Doe competes on the varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity basketball team, and the varsity softball team, she should be counted as four participants (do not include club or intramural sports participants, cheerleaders, dance teams, or pom squads). Calculate the same way for boys and girls. ${ }^{*}$ In addition, should $8^{\text {th }}$ grade students and below play on a Freshman, Junior Varsity, or Varsity team, they should also be counted for each team and sport on which they participate. 5) Calculate the percentage of female participation. (Row 1, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 1, Column 4.)
Calculate the percentage of male participation. (Row 2, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 2, Column 4.) Note: Row 1, Column 4 plus Row 2, Column 4 should total 100\%.

Note: While being within three percent is not a formal compliance standard, if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within $3 \%$ of Row 1 , Column 2 , then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

1) For Column 1, list the number of interscholastic teams offered for girls and boys at each competitive level (varsity, junior varsity, and freshman). For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8.
2) For Column 2, list the number of participants at each level. For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8. Note: The totals in Row 4 for girls and in Row 8 for boys must be the same as the totals in Form T-1, Column 3, Rows 1 and 2 respectively.

Plans to Address Interest:
When we did our survey there was interest in adding a Volleyball team. We have had the same interest on the survey in the past and when we held several meetings at school to see what interest we had, there were just a few girls show up. We will announce and hold a meeting to see what the interest is and go from there. We could start with a JV Volleyball team next year if there is interest and we could try and get a schedule together. Our school would have to hire a coach and provide the necessary equipment.
This year we had a boys and girls bowling team that started at Paris. We had about 20 students, boys/girls on the team. If it becomes a KHSAA sport we will have a boys and girls team.
We also have discussed adding a boys and girls corss country team. We have had interest in the Middle School and we will have a called meeting to see what interest we may have in boys/girls cross country.
