The responses on T-3 support the results of the Student Interest Survey. In the area of benefits, total athletic spending is significantly outside the acceptable parameters for parity both on a percentage and per athlete basis (\$632.00 per male athlete versus \$423.00 per female athlete). This should be closely monitored by school Administrators and the Gender Equity Committee so as to avoid a possible deficiency. Any plan or action should be reflected on form T-60 for the Corrective Action Plan.


