The school sponsors all K.H.S.A.A. sanctioned sports for girls at the varsity level. A total of 17 team opportunities are offered for female participation as compared to 18 team opportunities for male participation. In the benefits area, total athletic spending is inside of acceptable parameters for provision of parity on a percentage basis and slightly outside of those parameters on a per-athlete basis. The school's corrective action plan continues to appropriately address this situation. Thanks for your continued efforts in relation to this project. |

School personnel are continuing to make periodic reviews of the boys' and girls' athletics program reflected in the Corrective Action Plan.
In addition to the above information, the above referenced school maintains a complete permanent file relative to Title IX records including copies of the self-assessment audit, all corrective action plans, and other related materials.


Participation Opportunities: Test One - Proportionality


1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1).

Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total $100 \%$.
4) Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. For example, if Jane Doe competes on the varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity basketball team, and the varsity softball team, she should be counted as four participants (do not include club or intramural sports participants, cheerleaders, dance teams, or pom squads). Calculate the same way for boys and girls. *In addition, should $8^{\text {th }}$ grade students and below play on a Freshman, Junior Varsity, or Varsity team, they should also be counted for each team and sport on which they participate. If applicable, please asterisk in the above notation as to how many $8^{\text {th }}$ grade students $\&$ below are included in the totals.
Using the same procedure, determine the total number of interscholastic athletic participants that are boys, (and place in Row 2, Column 3). Add Row 1, Column 3 plus Row 2, Column 3 to get total participants and place in Row 3, Column 3.
5) Calculate the percentage of female participation. (Row 1, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 1, Column 4.)
Calculate the percentage of male participation. (Row 2, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 2, Column 4.) Note: Row 1, Column 4 plus Row 2, Column 4 should total 100\%.

Note: While being within three percent is not a formal compliance standard, if the percent listed in Row 1 , Column 4 is within $3 \%$ of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

1) For Column 1, list the number of interscholastic teams offered for girls and boys at each competitive level (varsity, junior varsity, and freshman). For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8.
2) For Column 2, list the number of participants at each level. For girls, total each of the entries in Rows 1,2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8. Note: The totals in Row 4 for girls and in Row 8 for boys must be the same as the totals in Form T-1, Column 3, Rows 1 and 2 respectively.
3) For Column 3, list the number of interscholastic teams that have been added in the last five years at each competitive level. Count each team added during the 5 year period only one time. e.g. Girl's junior varsity soccer was added 3 years ago, count the team only once, not 3 times. For girls, total the entries in Rows 1, 2 , and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5, 6, and 7 into Row 8.
4) For Column 4, list the number of participants that are currently on each level of the teams that were added in the last five years. If a team was added previously but no longer exists, there are no current participants to be added for that team. For girls, total the entries in Rows 1, 2, and 3 into Row 4. For boys, total Rows 5 , 6 , and 7 into Row 8.
5) For Column 5, calculate the percentage of participants that have been added in the last five years. For girls, take the number in Column 4, Row 4 and divide by the number in Column 2, Row 4 . For boys, take the number in Column 4, Row 8 and divide it by the number in Column 2, Row 8.
6) Note: If the percentage of current participants added in the last five years is $\mathbf{2 5 \%}$ or greater for the underrepresented sex (most likely girls), compliance with Test Two may be possible. If less than $\mathbf{2 5 \%}$, then compliance with Test Three should be analyzed. CAUTION: $\mathbf{2 5 \%}$ is not a formal compliance standard.

Remember, test three - full accommodation means addressing the unmet interest of the underrepresented sex (most likely girls), not the overrepresented sex (most likely boys).

## Plans to Address Interest:

A proposal has been made to the school board to start a wrestling team. Fundraising will occur to buy a used mat and to pay for buses. The coach will volunteer his time. A team will be formed for the 2010-2011 school year. There is significant interest for Lacrosse for males and females. We are currently exploring the possibility of a male Lacrosse club and a female Larosse Club however; it is not a sanctioned KHSAA sport at this time. We feel we are meeting Test 3 by offering all KHSAA sanctioned sports at this time.

- Divide Column 2, Row 5 by Column 2, Row 8, and place the percentage in Column 3, Row 5.
- Divide Column 2, Row 6 by Column 2, Row 8, and place the percentage in Column 3, Row 6.
- Divide Column 2, Row 7 by Column 2, Row 8, and place the percentage in, Column 3, Row 7.
