A total of 17 team opportunities are offered for female participation as compared to 18 team opportunities for male participation. In the benefits area, total athletic spending is inside of acceptable parameters for provision of parity on a percentage basis and slightly outside of those parameters on a per-athlete basis. The school's corrective action plan continues to appropriately address this situation. Thanks for your continued efforts in relation to this project.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of regular season competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. A team will be formed for the 2010-2011 school year. There is significant interest for Lacrosse for males and females. We are currently exploring the possibility of a male Lacrosse club and a female Larosse Club however; it is not a sanctioned KHSAA sport at this time. We feel we are meeting Test 3 by offering all KHSAA sanctioned sports at this time.
