E.	<b>x</b>	<p>Other Recommendation and Comments: The data and calculations submitted indicate that the standard established in test #1 for provision of athletic opportunities is currently being met. The responses on the T-3 form imply that the standard of test #3 is also being met. These responses do not appear to be supported by the information in the most recent student athletic interest survey. <u>As was documented on the T-65 form dated April 26, 2010, there is an indicated interest in girl's cross country(17). The current report shows evidence that this interest has been pursued for validity.</u> In the benefits area, total athletic spending is outside of acceptable parameters for provision of parity on a per-athlete basis and is barely inside those parameters on a percentage basis. <u>Administrators should continue to monitor this spending in relation to provision of equitable benefits.</u></p>
