- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first **date of regular season competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first regular season competitive event. 5. Describe your plans to address interest below:

Student survey indicates a huge interest in girls volleyball; we started a jv season last year and will play a jv season again in 2012 with the hopes of entering into varsity in 2013. Survey also indicates girls interested in archery. Will meet with principal to see if that is an area that we can get involved in and how we can go about meeting this need. Will have a meeting with girls to determine their real interest. From this meeting we will determine the ability to start an archery team. Bass fishing, administration will have to research how this works and how we can manage it. It would be a good sport for us as we are located right on the Ohio River.

Note: we tried to have bowling signup and didn't have enough interest to participate. We are attempting to start on a golf team however, the interest at this time appears to be more students in the middle grades level below grade 8 therefore their numbers don't appear on this survey. At this time, we have 4 middle grades (grade 7) girls interested in playing golf. However, when I spoke with them they are more interested in an intramural activity versus one at the competitive level.
