1. We are planning on adding 2 sports for boys and girls for the 2012-2013 school year. These sports are cheerleading and bass fishing.
2. We are currently offering skeet shooting and archery sponsored by our local 4-H Club. This is open to both male and female students.
3. In the fall of 2012 we will have a meeting with current students to see if there is enough interest to start archery and wrestling.
4. In looking at this year's report the percentage of female athletes declined slightly. One reason we believe this happened was due to the disporportion of female athletes versus male athletes on the bass team. We had 33 male participants with only 7 female participants. This is an area that we plan to address for next year's team with recruitment of more female athletes.
