2011 CHAMPIONSHIP NOTES

Russell Athletic is Title Sponsor of Commonwealth Gridiron Bowl, Finals at WKU Through 2014

Russell Athletic has agreed to a four-year arrangement to serve as title sponsor of the Commonwealth Gridiron Bowl, KHSAA Commissioner Julian Tackett announced during a press conference held at Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium on Friday, August 5, 2011. In addition, Tackett announced that Western Kentucky University and Houchens-Smith Stadium will continue to serve as host site of the event through 2014.

"Again, the corporate community in the Bowling Green area, along with the great folks at Western Kentucky University, have openly showed their appreciation and understanding of the value of the young people in the Commonwealth," said KHSAA Commissioner Julian Tackett. "It continues to amaze me the great community spirit and welcoming attitude that is displayed here in Bowling Green. From the fantastic folks at WKU, to the outstanding cooperation from Amy Cardwell, Vicki Fitch and the rest of the Bowling Green CVB office, to the generosity and support of the corporate community including our new partners at Russell Athletic, this town "gets it", as it relates to high school sports in this state. This move gives one of our marquee championships stability and allows for continued growth in the coming years."

Russell Athletic, whose official name is Russell Brands, LLC, is a Fruit of the Loom company with corporate offices located in Bowling Green. The company has been in existence for more than 100 years and is the leading supplier of team uniforms at the high school, college and professional level.

In addition to its collegiate licensed product line, Russell Athletics' Active Wear® is widely distributed through retail and department stores, as well as sports specialty markets.

"Russell Athletic is excited to partner with the KHSAA (Kentucky High School Athletic Association) as the title sponsor of the state football championships," said Gary Barfield, Executive Vice President of Russell Brands, LLC. Western Kentucky University and Houchens-L.T. Smith Stadium have been the site of the Commonwealth Gridiron Bowl since 2009. The past two years increased crowds have flocked to the remodeled 23,500 seat facility, the home of the Western Kentucky Hilltoppers of the Sun Belt Conference. Last year a total of 47,759 fans attended the event, the most since the event was expanded to six classes in 2007.

With a 2011 state championship, Highlands and Trinity (Louisville) would join the list of 11 teams nationally that had won 21 or more state championships entering the 2011 season. Sioux Falls Washington (SD) leads the country with 37 state titles.

History Of Success

Trinity and Highlands rank as two of the top three teams in state history in terms of all-time playoff wins. Having each won 20 state titles. Trinity's 119 all-time playoff wins, the most in state history, leads the teams participating in the 2011 state finals. Highlands follows with 112 and Mayfield has 103. All-time, the teams in the 2011 finals have a combined 648-284 record in the playoffs, a 69.5% mark.

Four teams that reached the state finals entered the 2011 playoffs with an all-time losing record in the playoffs, including both teams in Class 2A. Hazard (36-33), Glasgow (39-36), Holy Cross (Covington) (11-10) and Anderson County (11-17) reached the finals after beginning the postseason with a losing record. Three of the four teams now have winning records after reaching the state finals.

Welcome to the Finals

Anderson County (5A) and Holy Cross (Covington) (2A) are making their first ever appearances in the state championship game this weekend.

Anderson County reached the semi-state for the first time in program history. Anderson County reached the regional finals for the fourth time in program history where they are now 1-3 all-time after the win this season.

Holy Cross (Covington) reached the semi-state for the first time in the program's history. The team reached the school's first regional final a year ago in 2010, losing to eventual state champion Newport Central Catholic.

Welcome Back to the Finals

Six teams return to the state finals in 2011 after making an appearance in 2010. Hazard (1A), Mayfield (1A), Belfry (3A), Central (3A), Highlands (4A, 5A in 2010), Trinity (Louisville) (6A) are all returning to Bowling Green in 2011. Hazard and Mayfield along with Belfry and Central are meeting in their respective title games for the second consecutive season.

Trinity is making its seventh straight appearance in the state finals and 11th in 12 years. The seven straight title game appearances ties the state record set by Beechwood from 1991 through 1997. Highlands is in the finals for the fifth straight year while Mayfield makes its third straight trip.

How the Seeds Fared

Holy Cross (Covington) (2A) and Anderson County (5A) are the only two teams that did not win a regular season district championship and still advanced to the state finals. Each were two seeds heading into the 2011 playoffs.

Undefeated Seasons On the Line For Six Teams, Including Head-to-Head Meeting in Class 6A

Six teams are entering the 2011 state finals with an undefeated record in five different state championship games. The Class 3A game is the only matchup this weekend that does not feature at least one team with an unblemished record. All-time, 84 teams have finished the season undefeated as the 2011 season began. The Class 6A game features a meeting of two undefeated teams, the first time a "big class" title has been contested by two undefeated teams since 2002 when Trinity (14-0) faced Male (14-0) in the final state title game played at Louisville's Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center, a 59-56 win for the Shamrocks.

Mayfield, Glasgow, Bowling Green and Scott County are each searching for their first ever undefeated seasons while Highlands is seeking its 13th and Trinity its eighth.

- 199 state championships have been awarded in the sport of football in Kentucky.
- 73 state championship games have been decided by 21 points or more, 106 by 14 points or more and 123 by 10 points or more.
- 12 state championships have been decided by one point, 16 by 1 or 2 points and 29 by 1, 2 or 3 points.
- Before overtime rules were added by the NFHS, one state championship game ended in a tie. Flaget and Thomas Jefferson played to a 7-7 tie in 1971.

Mayfield, Trinity Have Chance to Extend Long Streaks

Mayfield hopes to register their 30th consecutive win this weekend while Trinity looks to become the 23rd team in state history to put together a 25-game winning streak with a win tonight. Mayfield enters the state finals with a 29 game winning streak while Trinity holds a 24-game winning streak.

2011 Playoff Notables

- Six teams opened the 2011 playoffs with consecutive shutouts: Newport Central Catholic (2A), Cov. Holy Cross (2A), Fort Campbell (3A), Butler (6A), Henderson County (6A) and Trinity (Louisville) (6A). The number was in stark contrast to the 2010 playoffs when there were no teams that recorded more than one shutout in the playoffs at any point. In all, 23 different teams posted a shutout in the 2010 playoffs.

State Finals Saw New Record in Total Attendance in 2010

In 2010, a new record of 47,759 fans saw the six game schedule at Houchens/L.T. Smith Stadium, breaking the previous record of 46,620 in 2007 at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium. The 2010 average of 7,959.8 fans was the highest since 2005 when 9,933.5 saw each game of the state finals.

Welcome to Bowling Green

Welcome to Houchens-L.T. Smith Stadium for the 2011 Russell Athletic/KHSAA Commonwealth Gridiron Bowl. The KHSAA State Championships moved to the state-of-the-art-facility, home to the Western Kentucky University Hilltoppers, in 2009 after six years at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium on the campus of the University of Louisville. Prior to Papa John's Cardinal Stadium, the event spent 29 consecutive years at the Kentucky Fair & Exposition Center's Cardinal Stadium. Overall, the KFEC hosted the event 30 times.

We hope you enjoy your visit covering this week's exciting action, as six state champions will be crowned. Should you need any assistance, please notify Elden May, Sports Information Director, located in the Press Box or any other KHSAA Event Staff. Beth Kidwell and John Campbell, KHSAA Event Staff, will also be in the downstairs media work room and the press box to answer questions.

Press Box Rules

This is a reminder that the press box, video deck, radio broadcast areas and field press areas are for working media only. NO cheering will be tolerated and spouse/children are not allowed in any of the areas. Anyone caught violating this policy will be asked to leave the press areas and jeopardize their outlet's chances for obtaining credentials to future KHSAA Championship events.

Reminder Regarding Credentials for Russell Athletic/KHSAA Commonwealth Gridiron Bowl

This is another reminder that credentials are issued to working media members only. All credentials are granted to a particular outlet and are non-transferable. The transferring of any credential without the consent of the KHSAA is strictly prohibited. Please don't risk losing future privileges to KHSAA State Championship events by giving your credential to anyone.

Postgame Interview Procedures

For the all games, all interviews will take place on the field. Please be cognizant of trophy presentations that will be going on around you and DO NOT hold up a team or player from an awards presentation. Any additional one-on-one interviews or radio station interviews are required to take place following the awards presentations. LOCKERROOMS ARE CLOSED TO THE MEDIA. Any additional interviews are to be conducted OUTSIDE the locker room and there are NO exceptions.

Team Box Area

Media are prohibited from being inside the team box area (25-yard line to 25-yard line). This includes just walking through the area to get to the other end of the field. Please remain behind the roped area and outside of the team box area to get to the opposite end of the field.

Media Work Room

A working media work room is available on the first level of Houchens-L.T. Smith Stadium in room #1081, near the entrance at Gates 3 and 4. Hot meals will be served in this room on Friday and Saturday at 10 a.m., 2:30 p.m. and 6 p.m.

Photo and Video Area

Photographers/Videographers are to remain behind the sideline level signage. Only game officials (chain crew, ball personnel) are permitted in front of the signage. In areas where the sideline signage is not present, photographers must be behind the yellow dotted line. Anyone with a photo armband or press box pass WITHOUT a camera will asked to remain behind the roped area on the sidelines. Only working photographers/videographers with the proper photo credential and equipment should be in front of the roped areas – behind any sideline signage.

Live Shots and Satellite Trucks

Satellite trucks will be permitted to park in the reserved parking lot on the north end of the stadium off University Boulevard near the parking structure and Diddle Arena. Live shots should be done toward the Berm Area and scoreboard in the closed end of the stadium.

Please note, NO MERCURY lighting is to be pointed in the direction of the field while play is in progress. If you require mercury lighting, you should point your camera and lighting toward the stands and away from the playing field.

Postgame Results

Results will be available in a timely fashion and passed out in the main room of the Press Box and brought to radio broadcast personnel. Results will be posted on the KHSAA website (www.khsaa.org) within 15-20 minutes following the conclusion of each game. Score-by-quarters, along with scoring plays and team and individuals stats will be listed on the site.
