The Board of Control of the Kentucky High School Athletic Association met at the Kentucky Hotel, Louisville, on Saturday, February 15, 1947.

Fresident Bridges called the meeting to order at 9:45 a.m., with all members present. Sam Pollock moved, seconded by Lyman Ginger, that the reading of the minutes of the

December 13-14 meeting be waived. The motion was carried unanimously.

Principal Tudor and Coach James art of Faint Lick, and Principal J. B. Moore, Coach Hugh Davis, Supt. Pearson, Principal Malter W. Moores and Mr. Prewitt, all of Madison County, appeared before the Board to discuss the recent fight between players and fans following the Paint Lick-Central basketball game. So much of the testimony was conflicting that Director Lyman Ginger was asked by the Board to make an investigation of the affair and to report his findings to the Board as soon as possible.

Ben Medley of Owensboro appeared before the Board to discuss the possibility of the St. Joseph's and St. Frances Schools of Owensboro being consolidated for athletic purposes. The Board advised him that the consolidation of schools was a forward step, and that he

should take the matter up with the State Department of Education.

Vice-President W. B. Owen and Principal James L. Cobb of Newport made a report to the Board concerning suggestive changes in the rules made necessary by the appointment of a full-time Commissioner to take office on July 1st. Lyman Ginger moved, seconded by Sam Pollock, that the Board accept and approve the report.

The secretary was authorized to invite State Supt. John Fred Williams to present the trophies at the conclusion of the forthcoming State High School Basketball Tournament.

The secretary was authorized to request Earl Ruby, Sports Editor of the Courier-Journal,

to see to it that game odds are not printed in the paper prior to the tournament.

Matt Sparkman moved, seconded by Sam Pollock, that James McChesney of Marion, who had been temporarily suspended from competition. for striking an official in the recent Marion-Earlington basketball game, be suspended indefinitely, and that Supt. 6. A. Hollowell be notified that at the end of the current basketball season he may apply for reinstatement of the boy. The motion was carried unanimously.

There was a discussion concerning the possibility of having the Spring Sports Festival at Louisville instead of Lexington due to the excellent facilities for baseball at Park-way: Field. The secretary was authorized to investigate the availability of Parkway Field

during the period of June 9-14.

The secretary stated that plans were going forward for the holding of the State Swimming Meet on March 29, probably at Richmond, and was asked to see if any of the Louis-ville pools would be available and suitable for this date, since four of the competing teams would be from Louisville.

Sam Pollock moved, seconded by T. K. Stone, that all bills as recorded and read by the secretary for the period beginning December 13, 1946, and ending February 14, 1947,

be allowed. The motion was carried unanimously.

The Board of Control was then called to order in its capacity as the Board of Directors of the K. H. S. A. A. Protection Fund.

Sam Follock moved, seconded by T. K. Stone, that the following claims against the Protection Fund be allowed:
