## **Kim Hawkins**

Kim Hawkins began her running career at Bath Co. in 1979 while attending the 6<sup>th</sup> grade. During Kim's running career at Bath Co. she captured seven (1979-85) individual Regional Cross-Country Championships, three individual cross-country State Championships (1983, 84, 85), eight individual Regional Track Championships, and 8 individual State Track Championships doubling in the 800m and 1600m from her freshman year through her senior year. She also led her team to a State Track Championship runner up in 1984 and a State Track Championship in 1985. She earned high school All American status her senior year. She won the invitational mile at the Mason Dixon Games. In addition to running, she led her basketball team to a District Championship in 1985 averaging 20 points a game. Kim earned a scholarship to Purdue University for cross-country and track, where she competed for one semester before transferring to the University of Kentucky. While at UK Kim set a UK freshman indoor track record in the 880 with a time of 2:13.47, and an outdoor UK freshman 800 meter record 2:07.51 in the National Invitational placing her 3<sup>rd</sup>. Kim was the lead off leg of UK's Distance Medley Relay team at the Penn Relays setting the fastest collegiate time in the nation in 1986. During her junior year at UK she captured the Oscar Mayer Women's Mile with a time of 4:50.17. Kim earned All-American status for track in 1986, 87, 89. Kim enjoys working with thoroughbreds, and in the past when time has allowed has been an exercise rider for Juddmonte Farms and Ramsey Farm. Kim is an Investigator for the Office of Inspector General, Division of Special Investigations.
