#### Nomination Committee:

It is with pleasure that I take this opportunity to nominate Owensboro High School alumnus, Mark Higgs, for the 2008 Dawahares/KHSAA Hall of Fame. Affectionately known as "Higgy," Higgs is one of the more accomplished high school athletes to come from Kentucky who carved a name for himself in the scholastic, collegiate and professional ranks of football.

More than 25 years since his playing days as an Owensboro High School Red Devil, Higgs still ranks in the top three in 14 statistical categories at his alma mater, and currently is the record holder in 12 of the 14 stats. Additionally, Higgs still ranks in at least five KHSAA football records, which represent the best marks in state history.

Higgs is the all-time leading rusher at Owensboro High with a total of 6,721 career yards (1980-83), which also ranks in the top 10 in KHSAA records. He is the all-time leading rusher for a season at OHS with 2,858 yards through 14 games (1983), which is also a Top 5 KHSAA record; and he's the all-time leading rusher in a game at OHS with 325 (vs. Owensboro Catholic, 1982). Higgs is the category leader at OHS for yards rushing per game, amassing an average of 203 yards per matchup (1983). He also takes honors leading OHS football in rushing attempts for a season with 349 through 14 games in 1983.

Football opponents had a hard time keeping Higgs out of the end zone, as he leads his school in total touchdowns for a career and rushing touchdowns for a career with 75, both of which are listed among KHSAA records. He also leads his high school in total touchdowns for a season with 32 (1983) and is the leader in points scored for a season in OHS football with 192 (14 games, 1983). An offensive nightmare when he played, Higgs leads OHS football in most yards in total offense in a season with 2,882 yards (14 games, 1983) and most offensive plays for a season with 354 (14 games, 1983). He also holds the OHS record for longest run from scrimmage with 97 yards vs. Union County (1983), which is listed in KHSAA records.

Figuring in the rushing stats at OHS, Higgs also averaged 8.15 yards per rush in a season in 1983 (349 attempts; 2,858 total yards) and scored five touchdowns in a game vs. Owensboro Catholic (1982) and vs. Tell City (1982). Respectively, he ranks second in yards per rush for a season and third in total touchdowns in a game at OHS.

Higgs made his presence felt in the collegiate and professional ranks too. Staying in Kentucky to play college football, Higgs is currently third in net yards rushing for the University of Kentucky Wildcats football program with 2,892 yards (1984-87). He still ranks high in UK football statistical categories for rushing attempts (4<sup>th</sup>, 532 att.); most yards rushing in a season (3<sup>rd</sup>, 1,278 yards with 193 att.); average yards per attempt (1<sup>st</sup>, 5.43 yards); best average per rushing attempt for a season (1<sup>st</sup>, 6.62 yards); most touchdown rushes for a career (3<sup>rd</sup>, 25); 100-yard rushing games for a career (5<sup>th</sup> with 9); 100-yard rushing games for a season (3<sup>rd</sup> with 6); and all-purpose plays for a career (4<sup>th</sup> with 591).

In the NFL, Higgs played eight seasons, most notably with the Miami Dolphins, but also suited up for the Dallas Cowboys, the Philadelphia Eagles and the Arizona Cardinals. Higgs was a starter for the Dolphins, leading the team in rushing in the early 1990s, and was a member of the Dolphins squad that helped Don Shula become the NFL's all-time winningest coach in NFL history. Known for his personable demeanor, Higgs is president of M&T Transportation in Pembroke Pines, Fla. Additionally, he volunteers his time for charitable events and youth clinics.

Kentucky native Mark Higgs is a deserving candidate for the 2008 Dawahares/KHSAA Hall of Fame.


## Alumni Spotlight: Mark Higgs

As a football player, former Dolphins running back Mark Higgs was always an underdog. He was told over and over again that he was too short to play the game and that he would never be successful. Higgs didn't listen to those who said he couldn't. As a result, he had a very prosperous NFL career.

As a businessman today, Higgs has been told by government estimates that 70 percent of all new businesses fail within the first year. Again, Higgs didn't listen.

Today, Higgs is the owner of M and T Transportation, Inc. and has a contract with Broward County to ferry hospital patients, welfare recipients and others that cannot afford their own transportation around the county. He has 50 vehicles and is on-call 24 hours a day. It is not surprising to see Higgs, who is single, drive one of the vans himself.



"This is a new challenge in my life," Higgs said. "Sometimes it seems there is not enough time in the day to get everything done."

M and T Transportation, Inc. is in its fourth year of operation and is looking to expand even further. Dade and Palm Beach counties would be ideal.

"I'm not where I want to be," Higgs said. "I am always looking to expand and I am always looking for more opportunities."

Opportunity is all Higgs ever needed. Every time an opportunity presented itself, Higgs was there to take advantage of it.

From 1988-90, Higgs, who was 5-7 and 195 pounds during his playing days, gained 251 yards on 59 carries. He had been with three teams in those three years and had started only one game primarily because he had understudied behind Herschel Walker at Dallas and Keith Byars in Philadelphia.

Each time Higgs succeeded with versatility, sneaking onto rosters the experts said he wouldn't make. He did so by excelling on special teams and flashing rushing excellence, ignoring the little-guy jokes along the way.

"I've always been the underdog because I'm so short," said Higgs. "So it makes no difference to me if I'm on the bottom working my way up. I've done it before."

There has never been a question about Higgs' physical tools. He was fast and could jump. As a rookie coming out of the University Kentucky in 1988, he set an NFL combine record with a 43-inch vertical leap. He also bench pressed 400 pounds and squatted 500.

Signed as a free agent by the Dolphins prior to the 1990 season, Higgs saw limited action with the Dolphins in his initial season with the team. So, it was odd that Higgs remained in Miami for the 1991 season, for this was the first time he had stayed with a team for consecutive seasons. Each time he moved, he had done so by his own choice. But the decision to stay in Miami turned out to be a good choice.

In 1991 and '92, Higgs had the most successful seasons of his NFL career, gaining 905 and 915 yards respectively. During his NFL career, Higgs played many roles for the teams he played on and fondly remembers the many plays he made for those teams. However, when asked to remember his greatest moment as a professional, it didn't take long for Higgs to respond. Surprisingly, it wasn't an individual accomplishment.

Returning to Philadelphia in 1993 for the first time since he played there in 1989, Higgs rushed for 68 yards and

scored on a one-yard run. But, what made this win special to Higgs was that the victory made former Dolphins Head Coach Don Shula the winningest coach in NFL history.

"I felt so proud after that game," Higgs said. "It was a great feeling and we celebrated all the way home. To be part of history is really something special and to share that with Coach Shula makes it even more special."

Just like he knew when it was time to move from team to team, Higgs also knew when it was time to leave the game. Once Higgs made up his mind, he didn't look back.

"I walked away from the game in pretty good shape," Higgs said. "I am very blessed that I am still able to walk. I took a lot of hits in my career."

One of the scariest hits Higgs took was while he was playing for the Arizona Cardinals. Higgs suffered a back injury and was forced to miss 13 weeks of the season. When the injury occurred, Higgs felt numb on the right side of his body. The first thought that entered his mind was paralysis. That was enough for Higgs to realize it was time for him to walk away from the game.

"I miss the locker room and the camaraderie with the guys," Higgs said. "I stay in touch with Ferrell Edmonds and Keith Jackson to see what they are up to, and I still go around to different teams and visit with players I have played with."

Higgs left the game with mixed feelings. The introduction of the salary cap changed the game in a way Higgs didn't think was positive. The pain he felt after the games is also something he doesn't miss. However, he does miss his friendships and realizes the game of football was essential in creating his life after football.

"Football helped me money-wise in owning my own business," Higgs said. "Also, certain aspects of the mental side of the game have helped as well. I used the same attitude I used in the pros to get my business going. There is a lot of adversity to deal with in the business world. Listening to Coach Shula's speeches really helped me. I find myself using some of the same lines on my employees that he used on his players."

Higgs serves on the Miami Dolphins Alumni Association's advisory board. He attends all of the games and just enjoys being a fan.

"The Alumni Association is a great thing to have," Higgs said. "It makes me feel like I am still part of the organization. Mr. Huizenga did a great job of putting this together.

Higgs wants to expand what the Alumni Association does by getting the younger players more involved with the Association's members. He envisions a big-brother type of organization where the younger players can learn life lessons from those who have already experienced it. It is a program that is very important to Higgs.

"So many of these younger players get themselves in trouble," Higgs said. "For the first time in their lives they have a lot of money. They need to make sure they give up the temptations that go along with that money."

Higgs may have been an underdog all of his life, but with the success he has had on the football field and in the business world, that distinction should quickly come to an end.
