In response to the Title IX KHSAA Audit Report, our district was asked to provide additional information to you in two areas: Selection of Cheerleaders and Prime Time Contests.

- Henry County High School has only one squad of cheerleaders. This squad cheers at all home varsity basketball games for boys and girls. There were ten (10) home varsity games for both the boys' and girls' teams.
