__To Whom It May Concern:

Concerning the complaints made during last season's Title IX compliance meeting the following corrections have been made:

Practice time:

As regards the problem with the conflict between junior high girls' basketball and varsity volleyball, the school has given varsity programs first call on all practice times. This has eliminated the conflict.

Uniforms:

According to Title IX, it was necessary for the volleyball team to purchase new uniforms. The uniforms were placed on order, however, due to logistics problems, the uniforms would not arrive for use until the season was over. Therefore, it was decided that the purchase of new uniforms would be delayed until spring 2001. Although later than expected, it will still be well before the next purchase of boy's uniforms.

Game Days:

Apparently some concern was expressed over the game days. The choice for Tuesdays and Thursdays as regular game days was determined in pre-season coaches' meetings. This was decided so as to not conflict with the Friday football schedule. Since this has not affected volleyball fan participation or gates, we found no serious conflict. Due to the length of the volleyball games roster, a consistent pattern of play dates had to be established.
