In order to determine the total number of athletics participants an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. For example, if Jane Doe competes on the varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity basketball team, and the varsity softball team, she should be counted as four participants (do not include club or intramural sports participants or cheerleaders). Calculate the same way for boys and girls.
- 5) Calculate the percentage of female participation (column 1) based on information from (column 4).

Calculate the percentage of male enrollment (column 1) based on information from (column 4).

Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in column 5 is within 3% of column 3 then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

(3, 6, 9) Example: Take the total number of female participants from the Summary Program Chart 1 (form T-1) and divide it into the number of total participants for each level, varsity, junior varsity and freshman levels. Perform the same calculation for male participants. For example, if there are a total of 300 female participants, and 180 girls are on varsity teams, 80 girls on junior varsity teams, and 40 girls on freshman teams, then 60% of girls' participation opportunities are at the varsity level (180 divided by 300), 27% are at the junior varsity level (80 divided by 300), and 13% are at the freshman level (40 divided by 300). 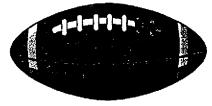
