

Dear Mr. Stout:

My name is Amon W. Couch; I am the new principal of Williamsburg High School. I replaced Tommy Day as the principal and athletic director of this school. I received a letter on Monday from KHSAA explaining that some components of our Title IX report are missing. That date was Monday, August 21, 2000. Upon examining our report, I have noticed some data concerning equipment and team numbers that contradict what is actually the situation. Furthermore, when I called your office today and talked to Ms. Sallee, I learned that Mr. Day had also not turned in data from the student SULVEA

First and foremost, I want our information that we send you to be accurate.
