

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first **date of competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first competitive event. ## **Apollo High School Coaches Salaries**

Coaching salaries are provided by the Daviess County Board of Education. The Board determines the number of coaches per sport and their respective salaries. All coaching salaries are based upon a percentage of a reference base teaching salary of Rank I with 9 years experience (\$38,234). [See attached Daviess County Public School – High School Supplemental Salaries] Any salary discrepancies between similar male/female sports are a result of the number of years of experience that causes the salary percentages to differ.

Some sports choose to provide for additional coaches out of their own budget. In the past, each head coach determined the amount of this additional stipend. As of March 28, 2002, a proposal to standardize these stipends has been made and will be presented to the Daviess County School Board. The proposal is to create an addition to the Daviess County Public Schools-High School Supplemental Salaries that would essentially standardize any "extra assistants" paid out of a sport's budget. A second proposal to add a Board paid freshmen softball coach as well as a Board paid freshmen baseball coach has also been presented.

## **Fund Raisers**

Each sport is allowed to have two fundraisers with the approval of the principal and the school board. The purpose of these fundraisers is to offset the costs of any "exceptional activities." These "exceptional activities" are non-budgeted items. Examples of such "exceptional activities" are (but not limited to) entry fees to special tournaments, travel costs for overnight trips, attendance to camps, special 'large' purchases or facility improvements.

## **Transportation**

Transportation costs to regular competitions are provided by the Daviess County Board of Education. The Board provides a lump sum of money to Apollo High School for all field trips including extracurricular activities such as bus or van travel to sports contests. All travel costs (mileage, gasoline, driver but not food) for away games are covered by this allocation. However, if a team travels a great distance that requires them to stay overnight or participate multiple days, then that team must have a fundraiser to cover transportation costs, room and board.

## Comments to Form T35 Budgets & Expenditures

⊗ The financial figures for the Spring Sports of softball, baseball, boys tennis, girls tennis, boys track and girls track are incomplete for the 2001-2002 school year. This is due to the seasons not yet being complete. Consequently, they have yet to make the majority of their purchases.

**Girls Basketball** – Attended Marshall County Christmas Tournament. Rooms were donated as part of the tournament package. \$221 under facility improvements were for the purchase of a new rim.

**Boys Basketball** – Attended Deep South Classic in Atlanta. Rooms were not provided. Team raised money to offset travel costs by selling BBQ ribs. \$221 under facility improvements was for the purchase of a new rim.

**Softball** - \$5,000 committed by Apollo for purpose of building new dugouts. Softball team has committed to having fundraiser to equal this amount. Softball purchased new uniforms this year. In addition, the softball players chose to play in additional tournaments in Kentucky rather than travel to Florida. A stipend of \$1000 was provided this year for an extra assistant coach.

**Baseball** – Under facility improvements, the team replaced deteriorating chain link backstop a brick wall and netting. This was funded by fundraising efforts of teams. Travel costs are due to team's Spring Break trip to Florida. Again, a team fundraiser offsets these expenses. The head coach provides for a freshmen coach each year out of his budget.

**Boys & Girls Cross Country** – Traveled to several overnight cross country invitationals including the Meet of Champions as well as the State Meet. The boys & girls teams host an Apollo Invitational Cross Country Meet and use this as a fundraiser to cover travel costs to overnight meets.

**Boys & Girls Golf** – Both teams compete in dual & tri-meets. This year, the boys competed in a greater number of invitational tournaments that required entry fees.

**Swimming (Boys & Girls)** – We have one coach for the boys & girls swim teams. Since there is only one account for swimming, expenses were divided equally. An assistant is provided for out of the swimming budget.

**Tennis (Boys & Girls)** – This year, we have a single tennis coach for the boys & the girls. All costs are shared equally between the two programs.

**Volleyball** – Under facility improvement, the \$1,688 purchased new practice standards. The team traveled to 3 overnight tournaments including the state volleyball tournament. They also purchased new travel bags & a digital video camera. Their fundraisers covered all these expenses.
