ON-GOING

1. Athletic Teams

There is still a need to continue to try and recruit more girls for other sports than basketball and tennis. According to the most recent student interest survey given to the students last month, there seems to be more of an interest in volleyball than softball. Six girls said they were interested in slow pitch softball, and only two in fast pitch. Fifteen girls were interested in volleyball, and nine more were interested in playing intramural volleyball.

We are going to start an intramural volleyball program next year in grades 7-12. We also plan to start instructing the younger kids in the sport of volleyball to try and create more interest. If possible we will start some modified intramural leagues for the younger students. We would like to progress from an intramural team to an interscholastic team in a couple of years.

2. Game Scheduling

For the upcoming season of 2002 - 2003 the boys and girls basketball teams will have an equal number of primetime games. We are correcting this right now during the scheduling of next years games.

Corrected Areas

1. Medical Training

We no longer get a trainer from Northern Kentucky University. The boys basketball coach handles the training duties for all girls home games and the girls basketball coach handles the training duties for all boys home basketball games. We also have a local E.M.T. on call for all home games in case one is needed.

2. Cheerleading

We still only have one squad, but this past year the same squad cheered for all home games, both boys and girls. They also cheered for both teams in the Class A Tournament and in the District Tournament. They will continue to do this in years to come. This is already in full implementation.
