

TITLE IX (2000-2001) CORRECTIVE ACTION PLAN UPDATE

- 1) Continue allowing the Girls to play premier spot at 7:30 and 1/2 of District contest being B/G is implented and should continue year to year.
- 2) Increase coverage in local paper has occured, with the girls and boys each having their own seperate reporter from the paper.
- 3) Adding intramurals; ie volleyball and etc. is still pending. The Board of Ed. is in the process of finlalizing plans for new Middle school, which is to include a new gym. This will provide space and time in future for the H.S. to do more (we are currently a 7-12 school, all using one gym). Also will help with paractice space for jv/v, little league and other sports for use duiring poor weather.
