North Hardin High School does not set specific budgets amounts for its athletic teams. General amounts are set at 3,500 for football, 1,500 for basketball, baseball, soccer, softball and volleyball, 1,000 for wrestling, track and cross country and 500 for tennis and golf. Coaches initiate the request process by contacting the gender specific athletic director. The athletic director then completes a P.O. request for the finance officer. Items are ordered on a need basis.

The North Hardin swim program travel expenses are paid for by the board of education. This is due to a lack of facilities on each of our three high school grounds. North Hardin travels to Fort Knox to practice and for home meets.
