- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. #### **NOTES FOR FORM T35**

- 1. The figures used on the report submitted for SY 2001-2002 reflected expenditures for that year. Since the report due in April 2003 requires the expenditure figures for 2001-2002, the same figures are used in this report with updates for spring sports.
- 2. Referencing the expenditure updates, the figures for travel for softball and baseball are lower than the numbers submitted on last year's report. That is because those figures were based on a projection of the 2002 season schedule. Since several games were cancelled due to inclement weather, the travel expenditures are slightly lower than the projection.
- 3. The expenditure figures for facilities improvements for softball actually are significantly higher than reported, but much of the work on the field was done during the summer of 2003 and, thus, the expenditures do not fall in the reporting time period.
- 4. There was money allocated for the newly-formed swimming team, but most of this money was used for event entry fees. Budget funds in 2002-2003 have been used to purchase uniforms etc.

#### Interpretation of "Interscholastic Athletics Student Survey" Results

The survey was administered on March 10, 2003 to the freshman, sophomore and junior classes at Calloway County High School. There are 730 students enrolled in these classes. On an average day about 30 students are absent. There were 455 responses to the survey meaning about 65% of the students completed a survey. Below is a review of survey results on a question-by-question basis.

Question #1 -About half of the students indicated an interest in playing sports; half expressed no interest.

Question #2 – All of the sports listed, except boys volleyball and girls field hockey, are offered at CCHS. Frankly, the number of responses is consistent with the number of students who actually participate in these sports. The real numbers may be about 25% fewer than those who expressed an interest. The responses to volleyball over the past three years led CCHS to organize a competitive volleyball team in 2002-2003.

Question #3 – The responses are similar to Question #2, and CCHS added a girls swimming team in 2001-2002. Depending on the availability of facilities, adding Indoor track might be considered in the future.

Question #4 – Again, the responses are relatively consistent with the number of actual participants in each of the listed sports. By choice, slow pitch softball is not offered at CCHS.

Question #5 and #6 - Consistent with responses for the past three years, there is little interest in intramural sports by CCHS students. And, where there is interest, the sports are not KHSAA sanctioned.

Question #7 — While the number who expressed an interest in non-school sports is somewhat high, most of the sports mentioned are not KHSAA sanctioned.

Question #8 – The responses to this questions like Question #1, show about half of the respondents play a sport and half do not participate in sports. The primary reasons for not participating are consistent with those expressed in past surveys – not enough time, prefer other activities or prefer to work.

Question #9 – While the responses are somewhat consistent with some of the expressed by school officials, the suggestions do not appear to be compelling events that will "encourage participation".

Question #10 - Again, the "other sports" for the most part are not KHSAA sanctioned.
