On behalf of Cloverport Schools and Frederick Fraize High School, I am writing this letter to inform you of our situation. I am asking that you consider the following, as you look through the Title IX forms that we have filled out.

You will be quick to note that we were unable to field a girls varsity basketball team this year. Let me take the time to explain the reasons I feel that this has happened. I think it is important to note that we have a high school enrollment of 73 students of which only 25 are female. We have had a difficult time keeping our student's interest in *many* programs and not just girls basketball. Our boys have shown a decreased interest in basketball as well. We are just as concerned about the future of our boys program as we are with the girls. Reasons for this lack of interest include the fact that from year to year, our teams struggle even to compete at the All "A" level. This contributes to a hopeless feeling that our student-athletes seem to share. With this feeling of hopelessness and the fact that more of our students are *working* when they turn 16 than ever before is a contributing factor.

Please understand that we will do everything in our power to continue the program each year and next year will be no different. If you have any suggestions as to how we might be more successful at continuing the girls basketball program, please feel free to share that information at your convenience. We will be more than happy to accept any help or feedback concerning this issue.

We hope this information helps explain some of the figures that you will see on the proceeding forms. At Frederick Fraize High School, we take pride in the fact that we are "fair" in our sports programs. Feel free to contact our principal, Edwina Sheffield, or myself if you have any questions concerning our Title IX compliance. We will be glad to assist in any way we can.

#### Dear KHSAA,

As principal of Frederick Frazie High School I would like to submit the following information concerning the recent questions about the lack of a girl's basketball team for the 2002-2003 season. The administration, athletic director, and coaches all met with every high school female and the junior high girls in an attempt to gather enough girls for a team. These personal meetings were in addition to the traditional open sign-up that is offered to all students for sports teams. The coach even held open gym for several weeks when we did not have enough players, in hopes that this would increase interest and numbers.

This is not a problem isolated in our girl's sports program, but is found throughout the school. We are at present working on Prom. Only one-third of the eligible students who can attend Prom are choosing to participate. We have been decorating for a week now with four students. As a coach of the middle school and high school academic teams, I have faced the same number problems. In fact I changed the format of the high school academic team and made it an enrichment project for gifted student so that we could meet twice a week during the school day. This change was necessary in order to have enough numbers for a team. I could give you several similar examples.

Lack of student interest is a disturbing fact and we are addressing the issue. Please understand it is our desire to have a girl's program and we are making every effort. However we cannot force participation. If I can offer you any further information please feel free to contact me.

#### To Whom it May Concern:

Frederick Fraize High School was unable to field a girls basketball team this year. Every attempt was made by the administration, including the athletic director, to encourage our girls to sign up to participate. Despite multiple meetings and announcements too few girls were interested.

While there are likely many factors that led to this result, I would like to point out a few. First, we have a very small school. Our overall high school enrollment is less than 100. There are only approximately 24 girls in the school. To field a competitive team requires somewhere around 10 to 12 girls. It is unrealistic, therefore, to expect half of the girls in school to participate on the team. Another reason is that many of our girls are involved in other extra-curricular activities, including after school employment. Students today frequently get part time jobs, and like it or not, many are not willing to sacrifice their income for the sake of participating in basketball.

Cloverport has had a thriving girls basketball program in the past and hopes to again in the future. Unfortunately, there are obstacles to overcome to achieve this. It is my hope that, despite the difficulty, they will indeed be overcome such that our girls will once again be able to represent their school and community as basketball players.

#### **Girls Sports Program**

I feel there is little participation in the basketball program due to several reasons. First, I think a certain player, of valued experience, transferred to another nearby school which is a district rival. She was overall the best player on the team, and with having few players to begin with, this created a devastating blow to the girls. She was highly looked upon and worked very well with the younger girls in the program. Next, I think the overall population in the school adds to the problem. Overall, there are just not that many girls to participate. Furthermore, if you look at the statistics I think we have a valid number of participation from the girls that wanted to play. Another reason for the problem is due to the lack of a feeder system. The girls have needed better encouragement and instruction in their development. That has not happened and therefore the girls have struggled with the game of basketball. I witnessed a few players who attempted to start playing at an older age, who didn't stick with it because of feeling "inadequate" on the court. I think there could be other girls in the same position possibly. I do think we have started to make an attempt to correct this problem in Saturday morning basketball by revising the program and getting practice times in and having the parents more involved.
