

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first **date of competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first competitive event. 

 Lisa Kingsley and Ken Olson contacted all KSD coaches regarding Title Nine Equity concerns. Response was that there were no problems with this issue.
- B. Student survey discussed:  
 Billy Lange and Priscilla Womack reviewed the survey from students. The report indicated there was no strong evidence to add, delete, or change any programming.
- C. Reviewed former years Corrective Action Plans that showed the follow status:

D. Corrective Action Plans for the 2003 – 2004 School Year

1. Merry Jo Lewis, student, asked that the Girls Volleyball Team be permitted to attend the Volleyball Tournament, same as the 10 other state schools. The way it is set up now, KSD arrives late and misses the pool play for tournament seeding. This prevents the girls from being able to be competitive.

Response: This is not a Title Nine issue. However, since the boys do not have a tournament and therefore, do not miss any activity like the girls would, the Committee thought a possible solution could be reached if students could make up lost class time before or after the 8 hours of instruction time.

2. Paul Kulick, Coach, suggested that a Charter Bus be used for Girls & Boys Mason-Dixon trips for safety. This is not a Title Nine Issue, either because neither, girls or boys teams use Charter Buses. Funds for Charter Buses need to be investigated.
3. Ray Reid, parent, asked if the students still have a Fall Homecoming. Yes. Volleyball and soccer would be used for the 2003 Fall Homecoming. Mr. Reid also suggested that an Alumni Football Game be added to the Homecoming activities.

No specific Corrective Action Plan Goal is planned for the 2003 – 2004 school year with the exception of upgrading the gymnasium floor.

The final KHSAA forms and meeting minutes will be sent to KHSAA and all committee members prior to April 15, 2003.
