

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- 4) Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first **date of competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. For example, if Jane Doe competes on the varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity basketball team, and the varsity softball team, she should be counted as four participants (**do not include club or intramural sports participants, cheerleaders, dance teams, or pom squads**). Add Row 1, Column 3 plus Row 2, Column 3 to get total participants and place in Row 3, Column 3.
- 5) Calculate the percentage of female participation. (Row 1, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 1, Column 4.) Calculate the percentage of male participation. Note: While being within three percent is not a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

## TITLE IX CORRECTIVE ACTION REPORT NOTES

- We intend to have meetings this spring and again in the fall to accurately determine the interest in girls' volleyball. The survey indicates that there may be sufficient interest to start a team. However, we attempted to start a team here 2-3 years ago after similar survey results and ended up with about 6 girls who would come to practice. If we feel there are enough girls with genuine interest, then we may start with girls' volleyball as an intramural sport and go from there.
- We have one cheerleading squad that cheers at each home game and each road game that is played in a neighboring county.
- The storage building for softball will be completed by this summer. Also, we have plans to add extra lights to the softball field next year just as we did for soccer this year.
