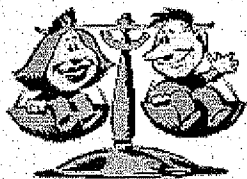

There appears to be a question relating to your Forms T-35 & T-36. It is <u>rare</u> that a school could spend <u>exactly</u> the amount budgeted for every sport offered. It is also <u>rare</u> that a school would spend <u>exactly</u> the same amounts for like sports. It is recommended that students be placed on the Gender Equity Review Committee, and that they be active members of the Committee.
