Dear Ms. DeVries:

Ms. Phillips made me aware of the problem with our Title IX report for this year. I apologize for the mistake. Both Ms. Phillips and Mr. Foley provided everything to the central office on time and it was our job to get the report signed by the board chair and see that it was mailed to your office. I am including the board agenda for April to show that it was approved and should have been mailed to your office. Mr. McNeel's secretary retired effective March 30th. We were without a replacement for a couple of weeks and someone failed to mail the report. This was a mistake at the central office, not at the school level.
