11. Status 2003 - 2004 Forms are satisfactory and no further information or action is necessary at A. this time. Errors have been noted with respect to the following forms: B. The following forms were omitted and must be submitted by school representatives: Other Recommendation and Comments: D. According to the data submitted regarding expenditures, the school spends approximately \$191 per athlete more on the boys' program than on the girls' program. School administration and the Gender Equity Review Committee should review this matter. The school has an enrollment of 458 students according to the figures submitted, and approximately 218 students were not surveyed. The school stated that grades 7-11 were surveyed, eliminating seniors from the survey. It would still appear that a large number of students were not surveyed.
