Responding to the memorandum regarding incompete Form T-63. In taking the survey (Form T-62) for a number of years now, this year I gave our students the following instructions:

"On question number 1, if your answer is YES (meaning we currently offer the sport(s) you want to play), do not mark any of the sports listed". Why would you? It does not ask what sport(s) you play, it ask what sport(s) you would like to play. Yes, means it is being offered. Play it.

"On question number 1, if your answer is NO, I WANT TO PLAY then list the sport not currently offered that you would like to play. Those results are listed on the T-63. Why would you say "No, I want to play <u>basketball</u>" when basketball is offered.
