Dear Mr. Boucher,

We would like to inform you and the KHSAA staff of our plan at Livingston Central High School to address the deficiencies pointed out in the Title IX audit visit on November 20, 2003.

First, our plan to deal with inequities in opportunities for female students is to offer girls volleybal! We have an organizational meeting scheduled for Tuesday, March 16 at 6PM in the high school library. This meeting is being promoted in our school, our middle school, and in the newspaper. Based on interest at this meeting, we will hold additional meetings for the purpose of creating a girls volleyball team. Our hope is to be able to begin play by the fall of 2004.

Next, we will be addressing the discrepancy in the number of our home girls basketball games in the prime-time slot. We have a 5th district scheduling meeting set for Monday, March 22, and at that meeting, we plan to make this a priority. Our intention is to schedule more Friday and Saturday night home girls basketball games so we will be in compliance with this part of the Title IX requirements.

The responsible persons for each of these activities will be: Mike Riley, Principal, Darryl Chittenden, Assistant Principal, and Mike Johnson, Athletic Director. If you have further questions, please let us know.
