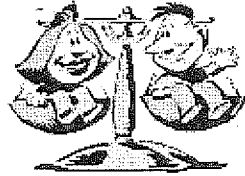

## Explanation of Expenditures

### A. Equipment and Supplies

The major difference is found in the expenses incurred by football. This expenditure is a total that will be paid during the fall of 2003. This amount represents the order of new uniforms for football for the 2003-2004 season. This was included on this Title IX report because the order was placed on February 4, 2003. This amount can be omitted from this report and the spending would be in agreement with the number of participants of both boys and girls. This expense will be reported on the 2003-2004 Title IX report.

### B. Travel

The expenditure incurred by the athletic department was lopsided basically because of the distance that had to be traveled and the number of buses utilized for these trips by the football program. A total of four buses (2-football, 1-cheerleaders, 1-parents) was used for each of the four games that were played a great distance from Louisville Male High School. This schedule was the result of not being able to schedule local teams within a close proximity to the school. This could not be helped if we wanted a complete football schedule. Expense in football includes the cheerleaders which can not be considered a sport of their own. The cheerleaders expense was also included in the basketball expenditures.

### C. Coaches' Salaries

Coaching salaries are the direct result of experience in coaching staffs. For example, the football staff have all been coaching the maximum amount of years. Therefore, resulting in the top of the scale in coaching salaries. Boys' Basketball has 3 levels of play with 4 coaches while Girls' Basketball has only 2 levels of play with 3 coaches. The same for Boys and Girls Soccer. Baseball and Softball incur the same amount of expenditures. Boys' Track Coaches salaries represent two (2) coaches that also assist with the Girls' program because of their specialization (Discus/Shot Put Coach and Pole Vault Coach). They are listed as Boys' coaches simply because the Boys' team has more involvement in these areas.

- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the **first date of competition**, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first competitive event. Using the same procedure, determine the total number of interscholastic athletic participants that are boys, (and place in Row 2, Column 3). Add Row 1, Column 3 plus Row 2, Column 3 to get total participants and place in Row 3, Column 3.
- Calculate the percentage of female participation. (Row 1, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 1, Column 4.) Calculate the percentage of male participation. (Row 2, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 2, Column 4.) Note: Row 1, Column 4 plus Row 2, Column 4 should total 100%.

Note: While being within three percent is not a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.
