		<ul> <li>It is recommended that your Gender Equity Review Committee meet at least once during the fall sports season, once during the winter sports season and once during the spring sports season.</li> <li>Forms T-35 &amp; T-36 are incomplete without written documentation to explain the reason for all of the blanks, especially in the area of travel. "Somebody" is providing transportation, buying gas, etc. This documentation must also explain the \$400 more a baseball coach is receiving over a softball coach, when all other "like sports" are equal. This documented information should be returned to the KHSAA no later than August 2, 2004.</li> <li>Sixty-six percent (66%) of your money was spent on boys when only 53% of your total participation was boys. No later than August 2, 2004, present documentation as to why there is such a difference in boys/girls money spent as compared to percentage of participation.</li> <li>On Form T-41, you have indicated that the boys' program has an advantage in equipment and supplies as well as in coaching. When you do have these advantages, you should be reflecting this on your Corrective Action Plan (Form T-60) the steps you plan to take to correct these issues. Your Corrective Action Plan does not reflect this; therefore, a new Form T-60 must be submitted no later than August 2, 2004.</li> <li>The KHSAA recommends that your 8<sup>th</sup> graders be included in the Student Interest Survey.</li> </ul>

Comment:
For the 2001-2002 school year, the results of the calculations suggest that the Substantial Proportionality Test is an area of compliance, with the girls' percentage of the total enrollment being 46.2% and the girls' percentage of total participation being 47.47%. This has moved Newport Central Catholic High School within the 3% allowance between total enrollment and total participation. Therefore, at this time, it appears that Newport Central Catholic High School is in compliance on Opportunities Test 1.

Comment:
This continues to be an area where the Gender Equity Review Committee at Newport Central Catholic needs to set forth plans that can bring the school into compliance in the History and Continuing Practice of Program Expansion. Positive steps were taken during the 2001-2002 school year but a decline was noticed during the 2002-2003 school year. The Committee needs to make sure that all programs are being counted correctly and devise a plan and a target date for the school to reach compliance on Opportunities Test 2.

Students at Newport Central Catholic High School have been surveyed to ascertain their interests in athletic activities. In the latest survey, students in grades 9-11 responded to the survey. It is suggested that, before the next survey, the Gender Equity Review Committee try to ascertain the majority of the members of the 2003-2004 freshman class and include them in the next survey.

Accommodation of Interests and Abilities	Х		At the present time, the accommodations of interest and abilities is rated as satisfactory.
Equipment and Supplies	X		At the present time, no deficiencies were found. It is noted that Newport Central Catholic High School does a good job providing quality uniforms to the student athletes. To help assure that the uniforms stay at a high quality level, it is suggested that the Gender Equity Review Committee adopt a uniform replacement policy that would include all of the boys' and girls' athletic teams. This replacement policy should become a part of the school's Title IX File.
Scheduling of Games and Practice Time	X		It is noted that Newport Central Catholic High School is doing a very good job with "prime time" scheduling with the girls having 17 "prime time" games for the 2002 – 2003 school year, which is 63%. A copy of the current policy that the overall region has adopted for girls' "prime time" basketball should be placed in the school's Title IX file and report. Although there appears to be no problem with the scheduling of practice times for boys and girls, a schedule of the gymnasium rotating schedule should be in the school's Title IX file, as well as be posted. Some slight problems were noted with the T-12, T-13 and T-14 forms. The Gender Equity Review Committee is to correct these forms and place the corrected copies in the school's Title IX file.
Travel and Per Diem Allowances	X		It is recommended that the Gender Equity Review Committee establish an equitable policy in writing for student athletes that would cover all of the aspects of travel and place the policy in the school's Title IX file. The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to redo the T-16 form and see that it matches what the coaches stated on their travel and per-diem

		reports.
Coaching	X	Newport Central Catholic may not be in compliance in the area of coaching salaries. At the present time, the coaches' salaries in baseball and softball are out of line. It is suggested that the Gender Equity Review Committee meet with school personnel to establish a school policy in regard to equality in base salaries in each boys' and girls' sport. If school personnel use a percentage of basic salary for percentage increase of coaching stipends, it should be included in the adopted policy (the school's athletic coaches' pay scale) and placed in the school's Title IX file. The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to look at equalization of the assistant coaches in all sports. The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to look at forms T-18, T-19, T-20, T-21, T-22, T-23, T-24 and T-25 to see if corrections are needed, and place the corrected forms in the school's Title IX file.
Locker Rooms, Practice and Competitive Facilities  Medical and Training Facilities and Services	X	Since all of the dressing rooms are used by all sports, the Gender Equity Review Committee needs to resubmit T-26 forms, one for boys and one for girls, and place them in the school's Title IX file. At the present time, Newport Central Catholic plays very few sports on campus. Several different venues around the Newport and Covington area are used and shared with other schools in the area with a system that seems to be working at the present time.  The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to redo the T-29, T-30 and T-31 forms and place them in the school's Title IX file. A certified trainer is made available to all the boys and girls at Newport Central Catholic High School. The weight room needs a posted
Publicity	X	schedule of when it is being used by boys or girls, or a particular sport, to assure that no one is being left out that desires to use the facility.  The Gender Equity Review Committee has

		some policies that relate to some of the subjects in this particular area, but none appear in the school's Title IX file and report. The Committee should be developing policies for the Athletic Department to ensure equal treatment regarding program production, schedule card production, and media guide production to ensure that other entities such as booster organizations do not affect compliance. The placement of banners/pictures in the gymnasium and commons area of the school should have a policy to ensure that all athletic participants have an equal opportunity for this "prime time" exposure. The school should continue its efforts to clarify the issue of trophy and memorabilia display. This can not be left to the thoughts of individual coaches or participants, but should be a systematic approach that will ensure the equal treatment of all participants. The school appears to have a satisfactory and equitable policy in place regarding cheerleaders for boys' and girls' home basketball games and football games. The school needs to make sure that a policy regarding the selection process and the cheering schedule is in the school's Title IX file.
Support Services	<b>X</b>	It appears that the T-35 and T-36 forms are not complete and do not truly reflect Newport Central Catholic High School funding and expenditures. The Gender Equity Review Committee should submit a report to the KHSAA by April 15, 2003 that shows a closer percentage of expenditures of the boys' and girls' athletics at Newport Central Catholic High School.

### 5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (T-60)

The KHSAA Audit Team discussed several items that needed the attention of the Gender Review Equity Committee at Newport Central Catholic High School in regard to policy development, and then making these policies a part of the school's Title IX file. The present Committee and school administration have seen some short-comings in the 1999–2000 original report, and the way that it was presented, and are aware of the changes suggested in the various sections of this report that they need to address for corrective action.

### 6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

This report specifies certain recommendations regarding the development of various written policies and a needed overhaul in the area of the coaches' stipends. In addition, there is a need to complete or redo several forms. It is suggested that the Gender Equity Review Committee add students to the committee. It is also suggested that minutes of all Gender Equity Review Committee meetings become a part of the school's Title IX file.

### 7. Facility Recommendations or Concerns

Although there is not a problem at this time, the Gender Equity Review Committee needs to stay informed of the many venues they offer for opportunities to their athletes. Things can happen every day that could change the opportunities and benefits balance that is currently present at Newport Central Catholic High School.

As stated in the SUPPORT SERVICES section the T-35 and T-36 forms are to be redone to reflect the true account of expenses by school and/or booster clubs in regard to each column that is listed on the report. This report should be in the KHSAA office by **April** 15, 2003.

(Selection of Cheerleaders) On or before April 15, 2003, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the manner in which cheerleaders are selected for boys' and girls' teams. If cheerleaders are selected in such a way as to result in arguably better (i.e. "A" team vs. "B" team) cheerleaders performing at boys' events, the school shall also submit a plan under which cheerleaders of equal ability shall perform at an equal number of boys' and girls' games in comparable sports (i.e., boys' varsity and girls' varsity basketball game).

(Prime Time Contest/Girls' Basketball) On or before April 15, 2003, the school is requested to provide information to the KHSAA concerning the number of "prime time" games scheduled (games to be played on Friday and/or Saturday nights) for its girls' varsity basketball team during the 2001/2002 season. To the extent that a fewer percentage of girls' games are played during prime times (when compared with the percentage of boys' games scheduled for prime times), the school shall advise the KHSAA of action it intends to take to immediately correct the difference.
