Errors have been noted with respect to the following forms: Form T-60; The form is incomplete – There are no items listed for correction in the athletic program. School personnel are to review previous Corrective Action Plans (Form T-60) to follow-up on status of on-going projects (ex. locker rooms, travel equity). Form T-60 is to be resubmitted to the KHSAA no later than June 15, 2004. The following forms were omitted and must be submitted by school representatives: C. D. Other Recommendation and Comments: The Student Interest Survey (Form T-61) should be distributed to students in grades 9-11. Seniors should not be surveyed. It is recommended that your Gender Equity Review Committee meet at least once during the fall sports season, once during the winter sports season and once during the spring sports season. It is not clear how expenditures for boys' and girls' basketball in equipment & supplies and travel could be exactly the same amount. The same is questionable about track and tennis.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams.
