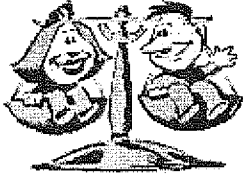



Title IX Meeting
November 25, 2003

Meeting was called to order by G.J. Smith. Members present Larry Bryson, G.J. Smith, Konnie Snyder, Brittany Turner and Elizabeth Johnson.

G. J. Smith was made Chairman and Elizabeth Johnson, secretary.

Smith stated the purpose of our committee was to keep equality in athletics.

All members received a copy of the Commissioner's Notes where it discussed prime time basketball games and that these games need to be home games. Snyder stated that she tries to schedule prime time games, but due to rotation, it is difficult to schedule these games because there is almost always a boys game on these nights. South Laurel Girls Team does have games on some Fridays and Saturdays. There are more on the schedule than have been in the past.

Smith took suggestions on improving attendance at girls basketball games, such as: club involvement and sponsors.

Evaluation will probably be next year. Smith noted improvements that have been made. New dressing rooms, storage room, weight room, softball complex and the addition of volleyball. Smith will prepare to do self evaluation on facilities.

Next meeting will be set for some time in January.

Title IX Meeting
January 31, 2004

Meeting was called to order by G. J. Smith. Members present G. J. Smith, Konnie Snyder, Brittany Turner, Lynn Parman, Jeff Jackson and Elizabeth Johnson.

Minutes were read and approved from November meeting.

Our school received a letter from the KHSAA stating that at least 40% of the girls basketball team must be played on Friday or Saturday. Currently the girls only have 8%. Mr. Smith will be working with both the boys and the girls coach on scheduling for next year.

Title IX evaluation should be either this fall or the next. The Title IX team will inspect everything from offices, locker rooms, storage, etc. It was brought to the committee's attention that the boys basketball coaches have more offices than the girls coaches. This is a concern for the committee and Mr. Jackson asked Mr. Smith to measure the square footage.

Sport surveys will be done again in the 9th, 10th and 11th grades. Every student must sign his/her survey to make it more valid. Surveys will be completed before next meeting which has to be before April 15.

Mr. Jackson wants to look at the possibility of hiring an athletic promoter. He also suggested the possibility of having a cheer squad and a competition squad. Students could participate in one but not both.
