

According to the data and responses provided, the school is meeting the standards established in Test # 1 and Test # 3 for Athletic Opportunities. However, the school can not be given credit for meeting Test # 3 because it only has a 57% return rate on its Student Survey. The responses on Form T-3 are to be based on a valid Student Survey. As is designated on Form T-63, you should strive for an 80% return rate. Another area of concern is athletic spending. According to the data submitted on Forms T-35 & T-36, you are currently spending approximately \$123 more per male athlete than per female athlete. This situation should be closely monitored by the
		school administration, as well as the Gender Equity Review Committee It is recommended that students be placed on the Gender Equity Review Committee, and that they be active members of the Committee.
