On future Forms T-35 & T-36, please only place the total expenditures and percentage for boys and girls on the bottom of Form T-36 (this would include the total for both pages). According to the data submitted, the school appears to currently be meeting the standards established in both Test # 1 and Test # 2 for Participation Opportunities. One area of concern is athletic spending. It would appear from figures submitted that the school is currently spending approximately \$130 more per male athlete than per female athlete. This situation should be monitored closely by the school administration as well as the Gender Equity Review Committee.

FOLKS: After our meeting in regards to this issue (Title IX schedules) I contacted Commissioner DeVries via email and sought answers to our questions. I got no answer from her by email. However, the next "commissioners notes" flyer December 20 edition, addressed the prime time issue. Notice it is now a "comparable" percentage of prime time opportunities for home games.

It is my belief that comparable is 50-50% wise. Thus next season 2004-05 boys and girls basketball schedules <u>will</u> reflect this percentage in Carter County.

I only hope that I do not have to take this to the Superintendents level to accomplish what is and should be law.
