To whom it may concern:

In September of 2003, my fourteen year old daughter was a freshman and a member of the Boyle County High School Varsity Dance Team. The girls would have practice at least three times a week either at the High School or at Woodlawn Elementary. After practice, my daughter would go to her locker at the High School and then wait to be picked up by her father or me. Occasionally, on Thursdays, she would walk across school property to Millennium Park (located behind the High School) to watch her little sister cheer at Rec. League Football. On one of those Thursdays in September, my daughter was attacked. Her attacker tried to rape her but was unsuccessful, partly because of my daughter fighting back and partly because one of her friends was near by. She was told by her attacker that she would not tell anyone about what happened and for approximately two months, she was to scared to tell. My daughter finally told me what had happened and the next day, my husband and I went to the school. We went to the school first because her attacker was a freshman football player for the High School. On the day of the attack, the boy was suppose to be in the High School cafeteria attending a football banquet. Clearly, the boy was not being supervised by any teacher, coach, or school personnel. The principal, Kerry Anness, directed us to the Danville Police Department. The police did their part and charges were filed. The boy confessed and even admitted to doing more than what my daughter had told the police. The case went to court and the Department of Juvenile Justice now has legal custody of the boy. Over the past several months, we have made many trips and phone calls to the school over this matter. We have even talked to the superintendent, Pam Rogers. All we have asked from the school is that they protect our daughter from this boy while they are in school and that they punish the boy according to the school's student handbook. According to the handbook, a student who commits a sexual assault/harassment is to be suspended or expelled and they are not allowed to participate in any school activity or extracurricular activity or events. For some reason, none of this applied to the boy who attacked my daughter. He was not suspended or expelled and he was allowed to continue playing football and then basketball. The school has no plans to punish the boy and will continue to allow him to participate in any and all sports at the school. To make matters worse, the boy has continued to harass my daughter at school. He doesn't say anything but, he does things like bump into her in the hall and stand in front of her locker. Once again, the school does nothing. We have gone to the police and filed harassment charges against the boy. We are currently waiting the results of these new charges. My daughter continues to live in fear and has recently started having violent nightmares. She feels that all this is the result of the attack and continued harassment. We feel that someone who commits a violent sexual assault should not be allowed to participate in organized sports. This whole ordeal should never have happen. The boy doesn't even live in the Boyle County School District and should not be attending this high school. He lives in Danville Independent School District but uses his grandmother's address in order to attend Boyle County. My husband and I feel that our daughter has been made a victim twice. Once by the boy who attacked her and again by Boyle County High School. All we want is justice for our daughter. As I write this letter, I pray that maybe your organization can help. I am willing to answer any questions your committee may have regarding this matter. Thank you for your time and consideration.
