5. Brief Summary/Analysis of the Corrective Action Plan (Form T-60)

After careful review of the school's past Corrective Action Plans, it appears that the school has made improvements and/or corrections in the areas of Accommodations, Scheduling of Games, and discrepancy in Coaching Salaries. The school has yet to develop a written uniform replacement policy. There are still questions regarding cheerleading and how they are selected or assigned to cheer for girls' and boys' basketball. The weight room did not have a posted schedule, and had no posters or slogans that were related to the male gender.

6. Observed Deficiencies in Overall Girls and Boys Athletics Programs

The school's Athletic Director should be provided a key to all facilities of which he expects to have under his supervision.

The absence of a certified trainer of the athletes of Cumberland High School is certainly not an equity issue since neither gender has the service; however, it could be a liability issue if an injury were to occur without proper personnel present during practice and game situations where injury is likely. The Board needs to assist the school in this area.

- 7. KHSAA Recommended Action in relation to new deficiencies:
 None
- 8. KHSAA Recommended Action in relation to re-occurring deficiencies:
 - (1) The difference between the baseball and softball facilities begins with a better quality field surface at the baseball field. The surface of the softball field is damaged due to the Middle School football team being allowed to use this field for their games instead of using the high school football field or the football practice field. The softball field does not have a press box or restroom; other amenities that are provided are not of the same quality that is in place at the baseball field. Therefore, the disparity still exists between the baseball and softball facilities. It is suggested that the Gender Equity Review Committee begin to make immediate recommendations for improvement of the softball facility. A written summary of these recommendations shall be submitted to the KHSAA on or before February 15, 2005.
 - (2) The amount of monies spent between boys' and girls' programs has narrowed; however, the Principal has minimum knowledge of the monies being spent by boosters because the monies are not in the school accounts. It has been strongly recommended to the Principal that control and management of boosters' spending be closely monitored by the Principal to ensure that booster spending does not conflict with the implementation of Title IX responsibilities. A written summary of the procedure to be put in place that will ensure the school's control of booster clubs and their expenditures toward high school athletics must be submitted to the KHSAA no later than February 15, 2005.

Interviews were conducted with two students, one of which was a member of the Gender Equity Review Committee. Also interviewed were the Principal and Athletic Director. The interviews were productive and informative.

Four members of the Gender Equity Review Committee were not present for the meeting. One board member Pam Sherman-Sheffield was present for the meeting.

No one attended the public hearing; the KHSAA Audit Team left the campus at 5:30 p.m.
