Purpose of the Gender Equity Committee

The purpose of the Gender Equity Committee is to review athletic and recreational programs on an annual basis and make recommendations to the superintendent and the Danville Board of Education that ensure equity in these programs in compliance with Title IX.

Membership of the Gender Equity Committee

The membership of the Gender Equity Committee shall include at least the following: the District Title IX Coordinator; the high school athletic director; coaches from high school athletic teams or cheerleader squads; and high school parents. The high school principal and the assistant principal shall be exofficio members of the committee.
