

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. For example, if Jane Doe competes on the varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity basketball team, and the varsity softball team, she should be counted as four participants (do not include club or intramural sports participants, cheerleaders, dance teams, or pom sqads). Calculate the same way for boys and girls. * In addition, should 8th grade students and below play on a Freshman, Junior Varsity, or Varsity team, they should also be counted for each team and sport on which they participate. Using the same procedure, determine the total number of interscholastic athletic participants that are boys, (and place in Row 2, Column 3). Add Row 1, Column 3 plus Row 2, Column 3 to get total participants and place in Row 3, Column 3.
- Calculate the percentage of female participation. (Row 1, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 1, Column 4.)
 Calculate the percentage of male participation. (Row 2, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 2, Column 4.) Note: Row 1, Column 4 plus Row 2, Column 4 should total 100%.

Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in Row I, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.

Dear Ms. Catlett:

I recently received your status report concerning our Annual Title IX Report for Dixie Heights High School. You indicated on the report that we had failed to list the dates for Gender Equity Review Committee Meetings for the 2004-2005 school year. None were listed because we did not have any formal meetings of the committee this year. In our 2003-2004 meetings, the committee had discussed several issues related to improving our facilities for both boys and girls here at Dixie Heights. At that time, renovations had already begun to address these issues and these capital improvements to our school have continued through the present school year. In addition, all of our outside athletic facilities are due to be upgraded in the next 2 years. Because all of these improvements to our facilities related to Title IX issues were in limbo until construction was complete, we saw no need for formalized meetings, although there were meetings with some members of the committee from time to time during the current school year related to construction updates and changes.

I recently discussed our lack of meetings with Mr. Larry Boucher from the KHSAA office and I now realize that we should have had our formal meetings even though most of our equity issues were dependent upon construction completion. We will correct this in the 2005-2006 by having a minimum of three formal meetings of the committee as required to insure continued equity between our male and female athletic programs.
