Y	Other Recommendation and Comments: It appears from data submitted by school personnel, with corrected calculations by KHSAA Audit Team members, the school is currently meeting the standard established in Test # 2 for Athletic Participation Opportunities. According to the data submitted, the school is currently spending a disproportionate amount of money on the boys' athletic program in relation to girls' programs. Girls' make up 45% of the current participants, but receive only
		35% of the expenditures. This situation should be closely monitored by school administrators as well as the Gender Equity Review Committee.
