  According to the data submitted by school personnel, the expenditures for each male athlete exceed the expenditures for each female athlete by \$250. This is a huge discrepancy. The KHSAA realizes that there will be a difference when a school offers football, but this is much higher than most. The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to seriously examine this problem and suggest
- changes immediately.
   Examination of the budget report for the 04-05 Annual Title IX Report shows little on awards, travel, and equipment and supplies for three of the sports.
   This could be one area the Committee could address as well as comparing the other expenditures for possible improvement in spending. The report shows they have plans to do this by including this problem on their Corrective Action
- Measures taken should be reflected on the 2005-06 Annual Title IX Report showing a decrease in the spending difference for male and female athletes.
