D		Other Recommendation and Comments:  The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to look at red flag situations that appear on Forms T-35 & T-36 and report reasons for differences to the KHSAA no later than October 15, 2005:  1) \$547.00 difference in Equipment & Supplies for like programs in basketball 2) \$977.00 difference in Travel for like programs in softball/baseball. 3) \$323.00 difference in Equipment & Supplies for like programs in baseball/softball. 4) \$1452.00 spent on Equipment & Supplies for boys compared to \$612.00 spent on Equipment & Supplies for girls.  Form T-41 reflects that school personnel are reporting an advantage to the boys' athletic programs in relation to Locker Rooms, Practice & Competitive Facilities.  The Corrective Action Plan on the current 2004-2005 report reflects that plans are to build a softball field on school property in 1-2 years. The same Corrective Action for the same issue was on the 2003-2004 report with the same time frame – 2 years. It is time that the matter receives immediate attention before the start of another softball season. The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to meet immediately and formulate a detailed plan needs to be signed by each member of the Gender Equity Review Committee and submitted to the KHSAA no later than October 15, 2005.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams. Ask coaches to confirm the names of those individuals who are on the team as of the first date of competition, and cross out the names of those who were cut from the team or quit the team prior to the first competitive event. Determine the total number of interscholastic athletics participants that are girls, (and place in Row 1, Column 3). In order to determine the total number of athletics participants, an individual should be counted each time he or she participates on a team. For example, if Jane Doe competes on the varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, the junior varsity volleyball team, and the varsity softball team, she should be counted as four participants (do not include club or intramural sports participants, cheerlenders, dance teams, or pom sqads).   Calculate the percentage of male participation. (Row 2, Column 3 divided by Row 3, Column 3 and place in Row 2, Column 4.) Note: Row 1, Column 4 plus Row 2, Column 4 should total 100%.

Note: While being within three percent is <u>not</u> a formal compliance standard; if the percent listed in Row 1, Column 4 is within 3% of Row 1, Column 2, then it provides a good target within which compliance is likely.
