D,		 Other Recommendation and Comments: The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to meet and discuss the nearly two thousand dollar difference in Equipment & Supplies for softball/baseball and send an explanation to the KHSAA no later than October 15, 2005. Form T-41 indicates that school personnel have reported an advantage to the boys' program in regard to Locker Rooms, Practice & Competitive Facilities. The Corrective Action Plans for the past several years have reflected problems with 1) the difference in softball and baseball facilities and 2) the difference in girls'/boys' basketball dressing rooms. Big improvements have been made to the softball field, but the same efforts have not been given to the girls' basketball dressing room. It is time this matter receive "immediate" attention. The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to meet immediately and formulate a detailed plan that would bring the girls' basketball dressing room up to par with the boys' basketball dressing room. This detailed plan needs to be signed by each member of the Gender Equity Review Committee and submitted to the KHSAA no later than October 15, 2005.

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- 3) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male. (Divide Row 2, Column 1 by Row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 2, Column 2.) Note: Row 1, Column 2 plus Row 2, Column 2 should total 100%.
- Ask the head coaches to review the most updated eligibility or squad lists for their teams.
