This results in a difference of \$173 more being spent on each male athlete as compared to the amount spent per female athlete. This disparity should be reviewed to ensure that it does not occur every year.

- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
- Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is female. (Divide Row 1, Column 1 by row 3, Column 1 and place in Row 1, Column 2.) Calculate the percentage of total enrollment that is male.
