Other Recommendation and Comments: Form T-41 indicates that the boys' program has an advantage in equipment and supplies and in the area of coaching; however, the Corrective Action Plan, Form T-60, does not reflect how school personnel plans to correct this situation. The Gender Equity Review Committee needs to meet and update the Corrective Action Plan and resubmit this form to the KHSAA no later than June 15, 2005. Forms T-35 & T-36 show several reports with "zero" spending on travel. This is very much a red-flag issue, because without explanation, nothing is "free".
