

Coach and Assistant Coach

All coaches shaft receive the prevailing salary as approved by the board. No coach shall receive an additional coaching salary from any outside source. No teacher may coach more than two sports as long as there are sufficient applicants within the system. No administrator is permitted to coach and no person may hold two head coaching positions. Any exception to this policy must be approved by the Superintendent.

Each team shall consist of the following minimum number of Participants members participating regularly: Football-22, Basketball-7, Baseball-12, Softball-12, Wrestling-12, Track-15, Cross Country-7 and Soccer - 15.

In order to staff a second coach for a minor sport, the following minimum number of members must be

Participating regularly: Baseball – 20, Wrestling – 20, Softball – 20, Track – 30, Soccer – 25, Tennis – 20, Cross Country – 20, Golf – 16, Swimming – 20, and Freshman Football – 23.

If a second coach is not hired in a sport where numbers meet the listed requirements for a second coach, the assigned coach may be paid 1.5 times the increment for that sport.

Additional Coaching Staff

Junior varsity teams and coaches are provided for football, basketball, softball, baseball, soccer, and wrestling. Their schedule may not exceed that of the varsity.
