On forms T35 and T36 (Budgeted and Actual Expenditures), the Total Expenditures was \$252,600, which indicates that 57.9% was used for boys and 42.1% was used for girls. If football was thrown out of the mix the Total Expenditures would be \$192,800 which would indicate that 44.9% would have been used for boys and 55.1 % would have been used for girls.
