D.		Other Recommendation and Comments: It is recommended that students be placed on the Gender Equity Review Committee, and that they be active members of the Committee. Expenditures for athletics should be carefully reviewed and monitored so that inequities in spending do not occur on an annual basis. Based on information submitted on the 2004-05 Annual Report, \$807 is spent per male athlete and \$522 is spent per female athlete. A difference of \$285 per male athlete as compared to each female athlete is a disparity and should not occur every year.

- 1) Determine the total number of girls enrolled, (place in Row 1, Column 1). Determine the total number of boys enrolled, (place in Row 2, Column 1).
- 2) Add the total number of girls and boys enrolled to determine total enrollment, (place in Row 3, Column 1).
