Even if there were no expenditures for equipment, travel had to be a cost if only for gasoline. If the School Board pays for travel, this should be so noted on the report. KHSAA Audit Team will continue to monitor expenditures for Shawnee High School. The participation of students in the athletic program appears to be the greatest challenge facing Shawnee, as well as finding funds to support and substantiate the program. If there is sufficient interest in softball and baseball, according to the most recent Student Survey given grades 9-11, the school is obligated to offer these two programs to the students of Shawnee High School
